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### HOLY LAND INSTITUTE FOR THE DEAF Salt, Jordan




A safe haven for 110 children and young people ages four to 25, the Holy Land Institute for the Deaf offers a full range of therapeutic services for hearing-impaired, deaf, and deaf-blind students, a K-12 academic boarding program, and vocational training.

HLID serves some of the most impoverished families in Jordan. Often parents' livelihoods are affected by their own deafness, leaving them unable to pay HLID's modest tuition. HLID receives no government funding and is subsidized by the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem, which has been deeply impacted by the economic downturn brought on by the pandemic. This Easter the AFEDJ community is working to raise \$100,000 to support ten deaf and deaf-blind students for a full academic year. As the pandemic-driven economic downturn in Jordan persists, your generosity is needed to keep these children at HLID.
