HEROIC, DISPLACED AHLI HOSPITAL STAFF ESTABLISH DESPERATELY-NEEDED OUTREACH CLINIC IN RAFAH



n early April 2024, a number of Ahli Hospital's L dedicated doctors and staff who were displaced by IDF operations in Gaza City late last year demonstrated their resilience by establishing an outreach clinic in Rafah, a city heavily populated with refugees and located in the southernmost region of the Gaza Strip. Rafah, now sheltering 1.4 million Gazans, has become home to those forced to flee the relentless onslaught of bombardments and fighting in the central and northern sectors of the Strip. Amidst the chaos, Rafah now emerges as the largest city in the Holy Land, surpassing even the combined populace of Jerusalem and Tel Aviv, the two bustling metropolises of Israel. The infrastructure and social services in Rafah, essentially a tent city lacking adequate access to clean water, waste management, and other key systems, are overwhelmed by the task of supporting even a fraction of its vast population.

Witnessing firsthand the acute need for medical services in Rafah, the compassionate team from Ahli Hospital, inspired by the unconquerable spirit of Ahli's healing mission, mobilized. Together, they opened an outreach clinic: a symbol of hope amidst adversity, to offer vital medical services to thousands of displaced Palestinians who have endured profound loss.

The Ahli Outreach Clinic in Rafah is an inspiring reminder that the care and compassion delivered by Ahli's remarkable medical staff is not confined to the walls of the hospital in Gaza City. We invite

HEART TO HEART FROM JERUSALEM TO GAZA IN TIMES OF WAR

Faithful to their vision, the Jerusalem Princess Basma Centre (JPBC) continues to serve displaced children with disabilities and their caregivers in Gaza.

espite all challenges, including recent damage to the Jerusalem Princess Basma Centre's (JPBC) new rehabilitation unit at Ahli Arab Hospital, the JPBC team remains unwavering in their commitment to serve children and families. They have found a way to actively support two displaced JPBC staff members currently sheltering in Gaza, who are both delivering essential emergency rehabilitation and psychosocial services to the vulnerable children seeking refuge among them.

Occupational Therapist Al-Zahraa is stationed at a shelter in Rafah, where 600 families reside in restricted quarters. Social Worker Musa operates from a shelter in Gaza City, where approximately 650 Palestinian Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) have taken refuge since the war's onset.

Under the guidance of JPBC's Medical Director in Jerusalem, Dr. Waddah, the JPBC rehabilitation team uses a screening tool to assess children with disabilities residing in these two shelters. They have also established a regular means of communication between staff in Jerusalem and in Gaza to exchange information on patient records and coordinate optimal care. Their objective: assist their Gazan staff in prioritizing and delivering services most efficiently given the extraordinarily challenging circumstances and conditions.

Al-Zahraa completed 35+ face-to-face has interviews. and is now providing ongoing emergency support and guidance for assessment and treatment of children with various disabilities war-related iniuries. recent underscored the critical need for medicine,

wheelchairs, and prosthetic limbs.

Musa has initiated psychosocial support efforts at the Gaza City shelter, with a primary focus on caregivers and strategies to alleviate children's suffering amid the war. He states, "I am dedicated to this work, focusing on the deep humanitarian need, regardless of religion, gender, and differences, because in this war people have lost their homes and livelihoods."

Both Al-Zahraa and Musa express boundless gratitude for support received from their Jerusalem colleagues and acknowledge JPBC's pivotal role in restoring some semblance of hope amidst extremely challenging circumstances.

Please keep Al-Zahraa and Musa, who are working under impossible conditions, and all of the Jerusalem Princess Basma Centre's patients and families in your prayers. Even before the war, JPBC did not receive adequate reimbursement from the Ministry of Health for residential services they provided for children and families in the West Bank, and the ongoing conflict has only further compounded this issue. Your continued support is critical.

INCREASING CHALLENGES IN THE WEST BANK CALL FOR URGENT SUPPORT

he ripple effects of the humanitarian crisis in Gaza extend into the West Bank, creating significant challenges marked by increased travel restrictions, disruptions in the flow of goods, and widespread unemployment. Institutions like St. Luke's Hospital in Nablus along with the Arab Evangelical Episcopal School (AEES) and the Episcopal Technological and Vocational Training Center (ETVTC), both located in Ramallah, urgently require your support to provide critical resources for patients, healthcare providers, students, and educators facing the harsh realities of war and economic strain.

The impact of the ongoing crisis in Gaza has led to a significant drop in income, hindering these institutions' ability to cover operating support, pay staff salaries, and provide essential educational and medical services. Urgent donations are needed to ensure St. Luke's, AEES, and ETVTC can continue their vital work, including addressing equipment



needs, securing supplies, and sustaining the provision of compassionate care and education under extraordinary circumstances.
